

ABOUT THE PROGRAM

Young Generations is an arts-centered restorative justice program for youth ages 14-18. Participants are given the opportunity to work with local professional artists, practice various art forms, and develop key life skills within a safe and educational environment. A program of Arts for Learning WNY, Young Generations is advancing the organization's mission by inspiring young people and educators through new and meaningful creative arts experiences.

HOW IT WORKS

This after school program meets in-person at the Arts for Learning offices,

located in the Buffalo & Erie County Public Library (Downtown location) every Thursday from 4:00 to 6:00 p.m. and operates year round. NFTA Day passes are provided to youth for transportation to and from the program. Snacks are provided.
